Annual Church Audit

Every year there is an audit of the church's finances, completed by a team of FCCDP volunteers. This year's audit team consisted of Kevin Donoghue, Nancy Schacht, Richard Schacht, Ralph Murdy, Andre Deadwyler, Jim Ruedisueli, and Roger Alde. During the audit, random months' records from both the general budget and restricted accounts were selected and reviewed. Deposits and checks were matched up and verified against bank statements. While this year's audit team found no evidence of significant errors or omissions, they did make two recommendations:

- 1) Develop an up-to-date manual of accounting procedures.
- 2) Update or add an addendum to our inventory of the church's non-cash assets/property.

Thank you to our volunteer auditors for taking on this important job at the church.

From our Historian, Nancy Meyer

The Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ is blessed to have two outdoor ministry sites: Pilgrim Park Camp and Tower Hill Camp. Both Tower Hill and Pilgrim Park are open throughout the year in order to serve the needs of individuals, families, and churches of the Illinois Conference and the areas surrounding each camp.

The oldest site, Tower Hill Camp in Sawyer Michigan, began in 1923 with the generous gift of 55 acres of land from the Warren Family. In addition, the Warren Family donated 200 feet of beach along the beautiful shores of Lake Michigan for the use of camp patrons. Over its 100 year history, Tower Hill has constructed and improved a number of buildings, including the new St. Philippus Retreat Center, completed in June 2007.
