Meet Our Very Own Golden Girls!



Easter Offering Thanks


Thank you to everyone who made special donations to the Church over the Easter holidays. Your generosity resulted in donations of more than \$2,400.

This group of men have, for 20 years, met every week (except for two holiday weeks a year) to maintain and improve the property of the First Congregational Church.

It started January 2003 when three members observed several pews in the sanctuary collapsing, and they decided to repair them. They met the next Wednesday and spent several hours trying to clamp, glue and screw a couple pews to stabilize them. One man was an engineer and the next week he brought a jig he designed to hold and clamp the pew. That made the job much easier, and they were able to more efficiently repair them all.

Then they realized that the church needed to upgrade the overgrown bushes and trees around the building, and they worked with a nursery to remove and replace the old vegetation. At this point another retired member joined the effort and they developed a comprehensive plan to upgrade the landscape. Church members raised funds and bought new plants, bushes and trees. Again, the group met on many Wednesdays to complete the work. Later another member joined, and they started to find more projects within the building that needed repair or replacement.

The Wednesday Work Crew (WWC) got serious! The Barwick Room (our main conference room on the first floor) needed an upgrade. The Congregation rejected a \$48,000 proposal from a contractor. The WWC took the project on and replaced old florescent fixtures with drop lights and ceiling fans, had a licensed electrician replace and enhance the 1929 wiring, removed the 1950's dark paneling and plastered the ceiling and walls. They finished it a new paint job, at a total cost of approx. \$18,000, a savings of \$30,000!

The WWC removed the 1950's dark paneling from the main hallway and replastered the wall and painted it. More people joined WWC and currently we have nine members every Wednesday.

When weather permits WWC maintains the landscape – raking, trimming, cleaning, picking up debris outside the church building. (*More to come next month*)
