One summer when I was four or five years old, I was playing in the waves, letting each one pick me up and deposit me a few feet away on the shore. I had the beginning of wisdom that was, if not fear, then brand-new respect for the fact that when you're in the ocean—even just standing up to your knees in it—you are not in charge.

If it's really God, and not actually the Atlantic Ocean, that is the vast and bountiful source of all things good and fascinating, then the beginning of wisdom must be to respect—if we can't bring ourselves to fear—God's power. And to know that when you step into God's world, you're not in charge.

May we all remember not to fight God's currents and to swim with them, not only the summer of 2023, but for the rest of our lives.

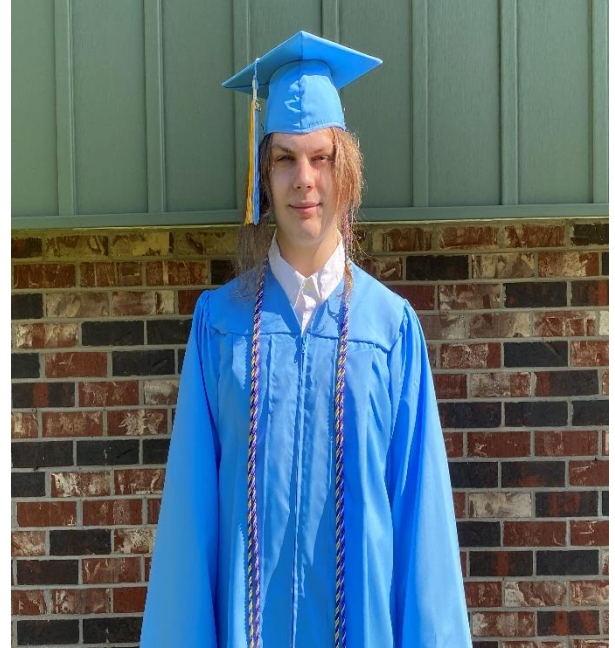

More ways the **Wednesday Work Crew** keeps busy!

WWC helps the First Congregational Preschool by keeping their premises up to date with requirements of the Illinois Department of Family Services. DCFS required the Preschool to remove paneling from all hallway areas. These were glued to the plaster and concrete walls. WWC spent all summer tearing the walls off when the school was not in session. They replastered walls that were broken or weak. The Boy Scouts painted those walls afterwards.

The WWC cleans up and replaces areas inside and out that are water damaged. Sometimes gutters overflow and cause plaster damage. After the roof is repaired WWC scrapes and replasters and repaints these areas.

WWC has remodeled and repainted every room in the building over 20 years – including the large community center room (Webster Hall) that at one time was a basketball court!

The 1960's vinyl floor in Webster Hall was breaking apart and was a potential trip-hazard. It needed replacement. [That's a story of its own...to come!]

After the floor was "done," WWC removed the vertical blinds from the gothic stained-glass windows and added a cove molding above the oak panels and removed white separators to "clean up" the appearance. WWC then repainted the 18-foot-high room entirely.

In 2011 WWC started collecting and recycling scrap metal. Churchgoers brought wrought iron, scrap metal, steel chairs, aluminum cans – anything metal – and WWC would load a pickup truck (later an 18' rented truck), drive to a recycler in Chicago and turn it in. For ten years WWC loaded and unloaded over 239,000 pounds of material and generated over \$31,000 for the church.

WWC has painted windows inside and outside. Some were painted from the roof. They installed new storm windows, remodeled and repainted both first floor bathrooms.

Their seasonal maintenance tasks include removing and installing air conditioning units, placing salt and shovels in the entrances, and doing the mundane tasks that keep a congregation viable.

The WWC has spent countless volunteer hours over the past 20 years to benefit our church and its budget. This group has also built memories and friendships to last a lifetime, which is priceless!
