"Be still and know that I am God!"

-Psalm 46:10

In our fast-paced society, amidst the loud noises of daily life, finding moments of peace and stillness can seem only like a distant dream. FROM OUR HISTORIAN, NANCY MEYER

During the month of February there were two banners in the chancel, as they are every February. I thought it was time to "explain" them. Don Cameron's sister, Ellen Knutson, (also my dear friend, classmate, fellow FCCDP confirmand) made them. I asked her to share why she made them and their significance. Best just copy exactly what she replied. Thanks, Ellen!



The one with all the singers represents our family. All of us sang in the choirs. When there were 5 choirs, we had someone in each one. Mom and Dad sang in the adult choir and we covered the high school choir, junior high, boys, and children's choirs. If a choir was singing, there was a Cameron there. [Dick and Lillian, Jack, Ellen, Don and Marj]

At least three of us also have directed choirs so the director could be any - Dad often directed the Amen after the adults recessed to the back. Thus, we all "SING PRAISES".

The PRAISE HIM banner represents the many ways Camerons made music. Obviously, we all sing, but the flute, French horn, drum and handbells also have been played by us.

I think the banners may have been for their 50th wedding anniversary but I can't verify that. Perhaps 1983? It's nice that the banners were in the sanctuary. [Normally in choir room]

I remember the story of how we got to the church. Jack Wills [long time tenor in our choir] had been to a concert in Chicago at the big hall (can't remember its name). Sunday Evening Club? Dad had at least two solos in the concert. One day after we moved to Pearson Street, Jack Wills came to the door and asked Dad if he was that Richard Cameron. When he told him he was, Jack asked him to come and sing in the First Congregational choir. That was how we became part of the church.
